Somerville Public Schools English Language Learner Descriptions of Programs

For students designated as English Learners

Sheltered English Immersion Program (SEI 1-3, SEI Integrated; SEI Special Education)

The Sheltered English Immersion Program (SEIP) is a K-12 program for students who speak languages other than English. The educational program includes English as a Second Language (ESL) and content instruction (math, science, social studies) aligned to grade-level standards. Instruction is primarily in English. Teachers use sheltered content instructional techniques* in order to make lessons understandable.

Unidos-Two-Way Bilingual Immersion (Spanish)

The Unidos Program is a Two-Way Bilingual Immersion Program. Approximately half of the students in the program are learning English (ESL) and half of the students are learning Spanish (SSL) as their second language. Content instruction is offered in English and Spanish (math, science, social studies) to both groups of students. Teachers use sheltered content instructional techniques* in order to make lessons understandable.

SEI/Alternative Language and Content Support

The Alternative Language and Content Program at Somerville High School includes English as a Second Language (ESL) and content area instruction. Teachers who speak Spanish, Portuguese, Haitian Creole and French provide bilingual support and use English and native language materials when available.

Opt Out into General Education

Parent/Guardian has the right to "opt out" of English Learner Education Programs. ELE Opt Out students are placed in General Education classrooms and receive sheltered content and ESL support.

For students not designated as English Learner

Unidos Two-Way Bilingual Immersion (English)

The Unidos Program is a Two-Way Bilingual Immersion Program. Half of the students in the program are learning English (ESL) and half of the students are learning Spanish (SSL) as their second language. Content instruction is offered in English and Spanish (math, science, social studies) to both groups of students. Teachers use sheltered content instructional techniques* in order to make lessons understandable.

General Education

Instruction is provided in English only and is based on grade-level standards.

- *Sheltered content instructional techniques include:
- grouping students by language proficiency level
- adapted materials and texts
- visual displays
- cooperative learning and group work
- primary language support and clarification
